Moving from a Pandemic to an Endemic Disease

The United States marked a new stage in the government's response to the COVID-19 pandemic when President Joe Biden announced in his State of the Union address "COVID-19 no longer need control our lives." He jumped the gun a bit as we have seen waves of Covid 19 variants spread here and around the world.

However, as many experts believe the virus that causes COVID-19 will never be eradicated, the world must at some point transition away from "pandemic" and toward an "endemic" phase. This will require the world to be vaccinated or develop immunity from an infection.

Pandemics are a widespread, rapid spread of disease, with exponentially rising cases over a large area. Endemic viruses, meanwhile, are constantly present and have a fairly predictable spread. That predictability allows health care systems and doctors to prepare and adapt, reducing loss of life.

So, what does this mean for us Christians? First, we must respect the dignity of each person. In the current state of deep divisions in our country on many issues as well as those who have different opinions around vaccinating or mask wearing, each side of this divide must respect the "other". Too often I have heard comments vilifying those who do not agree with another's opinion. We must stop that and work hard to talk to each other, listen to each other so we may discover our commonality rather than our differences.

As Christians, we need to safeguard each other. The Pope has urged us to get vaccinated. He urges us to wear masks. These actions protect both us and everyone else. The CDC has indicated that not wearing masks is OK when we are outdoors. The circulating fresh air reduces the amount of virus present. However, if you feel vulnerable, by all means wear a mask outdoors!

Those over 70 are the greatest population to die from Covid 19. If you are over 70 or have family that lives with you that is over 70, please follow all the suggestions of the CDC. Get vaccinated and get all boosters recommended for you. Wash your hands often and wear masks when you go out and enter buildings. This is common sense. We need to do everything we can to keep everyone well. With the new variants, it seems that you can get Covid even if you follow all protocols (vaccination, hand washing and mask wearing.) However, while it seems the current variant is less virulent than previous infections, that is not necessarily true for the elderly.

When this virus becomes endemic, that is we recognize the virus will always be with us, we will probably have to get vaccinated at least annually, like we do for the flu. The vaccinations created for the endemic phase will be a "tailored" injection, much like the flu shot is tailored based on what scientists are seeing as the latest variant that we face.

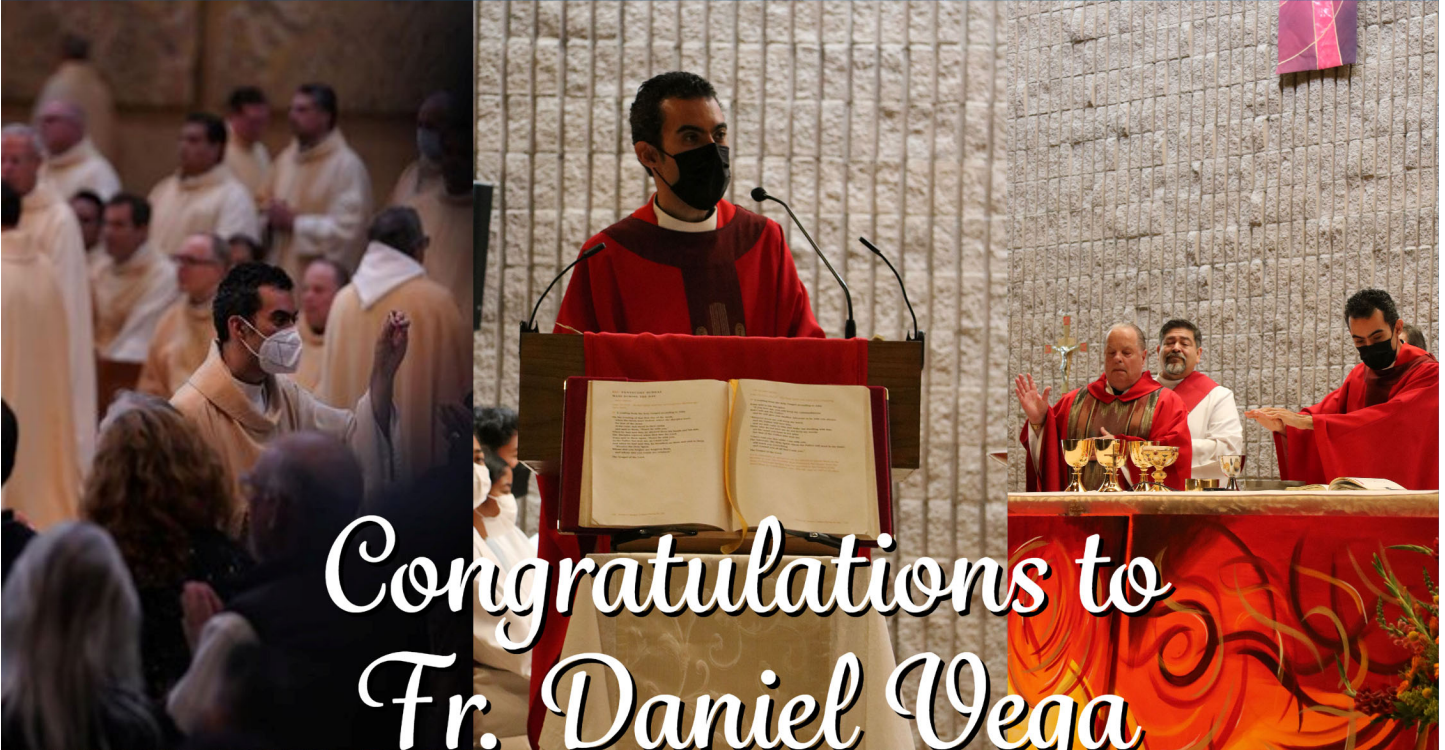
It has been a hard road we have travelled the last two and a half years. We have not yet come to the end of that road, though we feel like we can see the end. We have learned a lot about viruses, more than we ever thought we would know!

As Christians, we are connected to all people in the world, everywhere. We need to be in the forefront of making it possible people can be vaccinated worldwide. This is not a US problem. This is an everybody problem.

Therefore, we need to always remember that we ARE our Brother's and Sister's keeper.

This year's bible camp theme is Monumental: Celebrating God's Greatness. The camp will run July 11 to 15, 2022 from 9 AM to 12 PM.

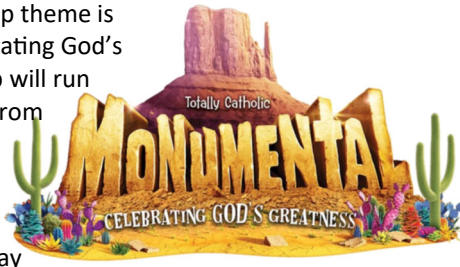

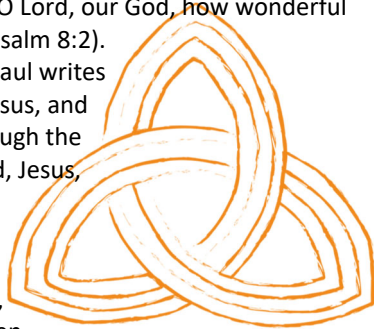
BIBLICAL ROOTS OF THE TRINITY

Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth" (Psalm 8:2).

In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity.

Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father—promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

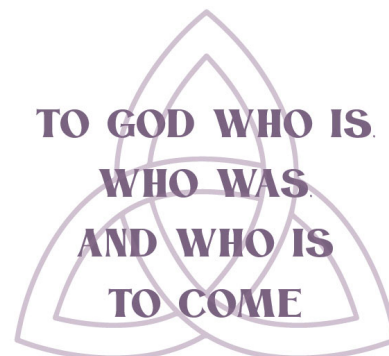
THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY TRINITY

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We say these words as we make the sign of the cross, the sign of God's saving love for us in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. God who created the heavens, earth, and all who dwell in it. Jesus Christ, through whom we are offered salvation and peace. The Holy Spirit, who breathes life, leads us to the truth, and strengthens us to live as God's holy people. On this Solemnity, let us pause to reflect upon the mystery of the Holy Trinity, three persons in one God. As we name the mystery, may we come to know God's love more deeply and live it more profoundly.

PERCEIVE WHAT CANNOT BE SEEN

Have you ever paused on a clear night to look up at the stars, or taken time to notice the splendor of spring flowers, the changing colors of the autumn leaves, or the still beauty of a snow-covered landscape? Such moments of quiet reflection may lead us to a powerful sense of wonder. The same God who created the stars, flowers, trees, and snow created each of us. In sensing God's presence in the beauty that surrounds us, we may be filled with awe in perceiving what cannot be seen. Moments of wonder and awe may take us by surprise. It may be invisible, yet in these moments we see the hand of God.



LOOK WITH EYES OF FAITH

Not only in the beauty of God's creation do we sense the presence of the Lord. In times of prayer, especially the celebration of the Eucharist, we are strengthened in faith to be assured of the mystery of the triune God. The Holy Spirit guides us to the truth—the truth of who God is and who we are in God's sight. Even in times of great trial, we endure and find hope in the mystery of Christ's love—Jesus, who gave his life for us on the cross and who rose in glory is with us in times of wonder and in moments of difficulty. We see the love of God in the acts of love of others and when we act as Christ's people in service and care for others. We grow in the capacity to see with the eyes of faith, eyes that recognize God's grace and are ready to respond by sharing the love of God, Father, Son, and Spirit, in the world.
